
Landscape Proposals: August 2023

Bands of woodland create routes and habitat for nature as well as natural screening in and out of the site. Combined with a wildflower seeding strategy, these newly established woodlands can become diverse and beautiful environments through which paths can be established. Trees providing spring flowering, autumn colour will be considered.
