# DEATH OF SANDY FRASER



Sandy Fraser, Rosedale, Essich passed on late last year as a result of a sudden stroke. His funeral was held in Inverness on 19th December under COVID restrictions, He was 91 years of age. Sandy was one of eight children and lived his early years at Migovie. He was a pupil at Errogie School and learned his lessons and Bible from Jessie MacGillivray. Sandy was a regular contributor to Stratherrick and Foyers News. Sandy's tales were a high point of the week for many readers.

Sandy worked around cars and Land Rovers all his life. He was either driving them, under the bonnet or under a ramp. When he started at MacRae and Dick one of his jobs was to clean the mud from the underside of farmers' Land Rovers. While the farmers went to Inverness Mart, mechanical repairs were undertaken in time for them to drive home. Sandy was a stalwart of the church. He sang and led praise as a precentor. Sandy was in the RAF and served at home and in Malta, even reaching North Africa which he said was 'very sandy!'

Sandy was 'always up and doing' at the bees, or in the garden. We have lost a strong link to Stratherrick from the 1930's and wish Sandy well on his last journey. Our kind thoughts are extended to Barbara and to Alexander and Murdo.

#### BOLESKINE BROLLY GROUP

The team coordinating the local response to the Covid-19 pandemic is currently assessing the impact it is now having on households and businesses in



our area. The Boleskine Brolly Group has asked residents via a survey to describe the problems that are being caused by the third lockdown and suggest ways of alleviating them. The challenges that are being highlighted include high winter fuel costs because people are at home all day, the pressures created by home schooling and continued social isolation. The Boleskine Brolly Group comprises the Trust, Community Council, Boleskine Community Care and The Knockie Trust. Initiatives over the last few months have included distributing food boxes, financial support, befriending service etc. The majority of the people involved in the project since early last year are taking a break consequently, we need new volunteers.
