

WELCOME TO YOUR HIGHLAND GATHERING SPECIAL NEWSLETTER!



We have something for all ages and abilities so please do join in! Please collect your registration form from the welcome tent on arrival and take it along to the main ring for 1pm.






WILLOW WEAVING WORKSHOPS

Rules

Only undocked dogs and legally docked dogs may be entered for exhibition at this show. No Dogs having gained a challenge certificate, reserve challenge certificate, green star or any award which counts to the title of champion in the UK & abroad.

Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times and you are required to clean up after your dog. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures or even on days that are considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.

If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for

any damage caused.

Right to refuse entries. Exhibitors/competitors are reminded that show societies have the right

under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

The judge's decision is final.


























FOOD AND DRINK

LOCAL PLACE PLAN UPDATE!

The Community Council agreed at its meeting on 30th May to submit the Local Place Plan to the Highland Council for registration - to become possibly the first ever Local Place Plan in the Highlands! Registration is a new process so we're unsure how long it will take, but it should be straightforward. It's simply a case of the Council checking that the plan meets certain basic legal requirements; they are not being asked whether they agree with the plan's proposals, because they belong to the community.
